Ruston Hornsby was based in Lincoln, England, founded in 1918. After many changes of ownership it continues (2022) as part of MAN.

This engine is similar in principle to the National Engine in the Waenhuis Bar, although on a much reduced scale.

Sandstone also has four other Ruston Hornsby stationary engines, 1930 PR, 9PB, 1948 8PB, 1933 PB (all presently in this museum), a Ruston diesel locomotive and two Ruston Bucyrus RB10 excavators, one a face shovel, the other a back hoe.
